Course Overview

This course reviews the basic duties and responsibilities of small drinking water system owners and operators under Ontario Regulation 319/08.

Participants will learn about disinfecting water with a UV light, along with the operational and maintenance req

irements of the equipment. Monitoring and responding to water quality issues through reporting and corrective actions will also be reviewed.

NOTE: Course content is intended for single connection systems with a groundwater source and no requirement for chlorine disinfection. For small systems using chlorine and requirements for secondary disinfection, please refer to Advanced for Small Drinking Water Systems (O. Reg. 319/08).

By the end of this session, participants will have gained an understanding of:

- Small drinking water system duties and responsibilities
- Knowledge of source water protection and maintenance requirements
- Describe disinfection of drinking water and operation of a UV light
- Perform common maintenance and routine checks required for a UV light
- Responding to potential drinking water quality issues

Target Audience

This course is geared to owners and operators of small drinking water systems under Ontario Regulation 319/08 with a single connection and no requirement for chlorine disinfection.

Meningococcal (meningitis)

- Vaccine: Nimenrix® or Menactra®
- Doses: One
- **Required for school.**

Hepatitis B

- Vaccine: Recombivax® HB or Engerix-B®

- Doses: Two (if second dose is not given before the child is 16 years of age, a third dose is needed).
- Recommended, but not required for school.

Human Papillomavirus (HPV)

- Vaccine: Gardasil® 9
- Doses: Two (if first dose is not given before the child is 15 years of age, then three doses are needed).
- Recommended, but not required for school.

Consent forms and information packages are sent home with students in early September. The Health Unit will only immunize students whose parent or caregiver has completed the consent form and signed “YES”.

Tips for clinic day

- eat a good breakfast.
- bring a lunch.
- wear a short-sleeved shirt.
- bring a distraction: music, a book or a game.
- know that the needle may feel like a pinch in the upper arm and should only last for a few seconds.
